Celebrating the Easter Season

Lent is long-forty days; but the Easter Season is even longer-50 days! Obviously the Church wants us to rejoice and celebrate the “Feast of Feasts” for more than a day. After all, good is triumphant over evil, and our God is willing to share his risen life with us, so that we, too, can live forever. As disciples of Christ we know that, but is it evident in our homes? Through the 50 days of the Easter Season, remind the members of your “little home church” of their Easter faith. Proclaim your Christian identity to all who visit.

- Meet at the “Alleluia” sign for a bedtime hug.
- Use a white tablecloth (plastic or cloth) at mealtimes to remind us of this holy season.
- Light an Easter candle or plain white candle at the evening meal from Easter to Pentecost. As it is being lit, say, Christ is the Light of the World.
- A sung or said “Alleluia” might be added to the meal prayer.
