Liturgical Reflection When the faithful adore Christ present in the Sacrament, they remember that this presence derives from the Sacrifice of the Mass and has its purpose both sacramental and spiritual communion. Prayer before Christ the Lord sacramentally present in the reserved Eucharist extends the union with Christ that the faithful have reached in the reception of Holy Communion at Mass. Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament renews the covenant that in turn moves the faithful to maintain by their way of life what they have received through faith. A Time to Grow

Lent is a time to grow in our faith and in our spirituality. Here are some family ideas for Lent practices:

- Offer a smile and warm greeting to a person that you usually criticize or regard with dislike.
- Visually fast by putting away a favorite knickknack or decoration, and leaving the space open.
- Volunteer to help do spring cleaning in a public space, for example, a park building or street.
- Increase the time you spend on family prayer.
- Take fifteen minutes or so every evening to read aloud with your family from the Bible or a spiritual book.
- Fast from a certain food throughout Lent, and donate that item to a food pantry or soup kit.
