Sacrament of Baptism of Infants:

By appointment, preferably celebrated within the 9:00 a.m. Sunday Mass, families, regardless of religious affiliation, are encouraged to attend and participate in Baptismal Sacramental Preparation and Celebration. Sponsor certificate must be received at the Parish Office if the sponsors are not members of Saint Catherine of Siena Church.

Becoming Catholic:

This is an ongoing journey of preparation. We invite all who are interested to contact the Parish Office or drop a note into the collection basket with your intention to become a Catholic, your name, address and telephone number to contact you for further information. Sacrament of Baptism or Reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church will be celebrated at Easter Vigil on March 27, 2016.

Adult Confirmation:

Are you an adult who has not been confirmed? We invite you to complete your initiation into our Christian community and to affirm the faith, which you were baptized. You will become part of our Christian Initiation Classes for those becoming Catholics. Your formation process will culminate with the Sacrament of Confirmation celebrated at the Easter Vigil on March 27, 2016.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: One half hour before Saturday evening and Sunday morning Masses or anytime by appointment/request.

Sacrament of Matrimony:

Make the arrangement with the Parish Office at least nine months *prior* to celebration of your wedding.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:

Request the Anointing of the Sick when you know the date of an upcoming medical procedure or the beginning of the medical treatment by calling the Parish Office. The peace that the Sacrament offers can be yours during the days you prepare for the medical appointment.

Ministry of Caring - Communion to the Sick, Hospital, and Shut-In Visits:

If you have a family member who needs Holy Communion taken to them on Friday mornings, please call the Parish Office during the regular Office Hours, so we can arrange for trained Extraordinary Minister of the Holy Communion to visit. Also, **please notify the Parish Office if you know someone at home or in the hospital.** The hospitals do not notify the Parish Office of hospital stays, so please have a family member call the office. Anyone who needs to be included on the First Fridays' Visitation list of the Sick, please call the Parish Office. Father will try to visit them each month during the day of the First Friday of the month.

Catholic Devotions in Our Parish

Marian Devotions:

Approximately 30 minutes before each Mass begins with the recitation of the Holy Rosary.

Sponsor Certificates: If you are asked to be a Baptism or Confirmation sponsor, our parish secretary can help you with the required certificate. Please call the Parish Office *at least one month prior* to the celebration of the Sacrament. This presumes that you are a registered member of Saint Catherine of Siena Church and practicing Catholic living a valid Church Marriage (if married).

Certificates: Copies of certificates for Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist, Confirmation, and Marriage received at Saint Catherine of Siena you may request by calling the Parish Office.

Are you a member of Saint Catherine of Sienna Roman Catholic Church? In order to be considered a member of Saint Catherine of Siena Roman Catholic Church you must submit the REGISTRATION/UPDATE form, located in the sacristy of the church, or you may call the Parish Office to obtain one. If you are not receiving the collection envelopes, most likely you are not registered at this time. If you are a new member currently attending Saint Catherine liturgies, who has not yet registered, or any young adults, 18 or older previously listed as members under their parent's household, please take a moment to fill out this form. In case you moved and began to use new mailing address, please contact the Parish Office, before your mail forwarding service will expire and the parish will not be charged extra fees by the local Post Offices.

If you know of *Prayer Requests for a sick parishioner:* Write the name or petition in our Parish Prayer Request Book located in the vestibule of our church. The Prayer Request Book is brought into the church at each weekend Mass and all the intentions are included in the General Intercessions.

Bulletin and Parish Announcements: To place an article into our bulletin, please contact the Parish Office by 10:00 a.m. Tuesday before the weekend. To place an announcement for the weekend Masses, please contact the Parish Office before 12:00 p.m. on Friday.

Family Moments

"You don't choose your family. They are God's gift to you, as you are to them." -Archbishop Desmond Tutu

Families today are pulled in so many directions, it's near impossible to find an open night on the communal calendar to stay home and spend time together. Even when parents make a concerted effort to limit extracurricular activities, things eventually reach critical mass, with dad running back and forth between soccer fields while mom juggles music lessons and grocery shopping.

When it comes to reshaping our home lives to include more family time, there are lots of options. At the top of the list is family meal time. No matter how busy our home life may be, it's critical that we find time to eat together at least a few nights every week. But what if it's just not possible some weeks? Here's an idea: What if we eat breakfast together on a day when dinner won't work? What if we have cocoa and cookies on a night when we miss family dinner? What if we put aside the household chores on a Saturday to make a special meal? No one said it has to be gourmet. Let our new motto be: Eating PBJ's as a family is better than eating filet mignon alone.

In addition to meal time, a strong family relies on a strong marriage, a relationship between husband and wife that is not only loving and loyal at its core but obviously so to the children. Seeing mom and dad in a caring relationship helps children understand how to build their own loving relationships—within the existing family and eventually in their own adult lives and families.

"Non-doing." There's a concept that's foreign to our culture today. Sometimes doing nothing with our children is the greatest gift we can give. Turn off all devices and distractions that keeps your family from really hearing each other. Rather than staring at screens family members can look and interact with each other.

Liturgical Reflection... The Psalmist may be a liturgical ministry independent of the reading and cantor ministries. It is the psalmist's place to sing the Psalm or other biblical canticle between the two readings. To carry out this function correctly, it is necessary for the psalmist to be accomplished in the art of singing Psalms and possess a facility in public speaking and elocution. The psalmist processes into Mass with the two readers in front of the Priest and the Deacon. The psalmist is seated with the readers in the sanctuary and returns with them to his/her place following the second reading. General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Number 102.
