Dinnertime PRAYER

If your family drones off "Bless Us, O Lord" before dinner lacks a prayerful intention, change things up...with silence. Start with less than 30 seconds of silence and work yourselves up to around two minutes. "Around our little table each night there is a sort of collective sigh as we relax into this one quiet moment. The point of holding this silence is to deepen one's attention," writes Kim John Payne in Simplicity Parenting (Ballentine). "We aren't always aware of the tension we're carrying. For a child who talks or moves or fidgets quite continuously all day, this moment of quiet stillness will be very noticeable. A moment of silence not only releases the tension of constant doing, it presents a remarkable alternative: just being. Calm. Now, you may say "Grace."
