Bishop Announces Date for Restoring the Sunday Mass Obligation: Bishop Mark has announced the return of the **Sunday and Holy Day Mass Obligation** in the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown beginning **August 15, 2021**. The Bishop reminded the faithful that our parish churches are our spiritual home, and extended a warm invitation for everyone to start anew.

Signs of Growth: “As we become more conscious that faith develops in stages, we also come to some practical conclusions. For example, we may need to learn patience and realize that some things are beyond our control: It may simply take a certain amount of time, and even trial-and-error, to get from one stage to another. We need to trust that God is in the often uneven process of our growth in faith. Therefore, it’s okay to feel conflict, fear and doubt or to face hard questions. This may even be our cue to reach out to others for help and guidance, which is already a sign of growth.”
