The Bob Perks Cancer Assistance Fund (BPF) helps ease the financial burden of individuals and families in our community who are battling cancer by providing funding for basic necessities (rent, utilities, gas & grocery gift cards, etc.) so their focus is on treatment and recovery. The organization supports individual living in Blair, Centre, Clearfield, Huntingdon, Mifflin and Juniata Counties. Qualified applicants can receive up to \$1,000 every 90 days, and are referred by their oncology team. In 2023, BPF allocated nearly \$275,000 to 424 cancer patients in their six-county service area. All funds raised stay in our local communities.

<u>Stewardship Reflections</u> June 23, 2024 –

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time Our readings today remind us that God always has our best interests in mind. No matter what is going on in our lives, God is with us. Our First Reading is from the end of the book of Job. The book of Job is an incredible story of God allowing trials and suffering to occur in Job's life. God knows that Job is a faithful man and will not turn away from Him despite hardship, so the Lord allows destruction in Job's life. In moments of trial, we often live our days in a panic. It is as if our life is like the life of those disciples. We see the water coming into our boat and we do all that we can in our power to stay afloat. We aimlessly try to throw the water overboard, and we become exhausted because it is thrown right back into our face. We are frantic, so we fail to stop and recognize that our Savior is in the same boat with us. Although it might feel like He is sleeping and His presence is lacking. He is right there suffering with us. Therefore, during our trials, cling to Jesus. Know that there is an end, and whether we see the end in this life or the next, God allows it all for our salvation. Today, let us thank God for His presence in our lives, and ask for

the eyes of faith to see that He is right here with us always.
