Baptism Beyond Babyhood

A baptism Sunday church is an excellent opportunity to talk to your kids about what the sacrament means. Kids love hearing about themselves as babies, so use that as your ticket into the conversation.

Talk about the hopes you had for them when they were so small. Did you imagine them going to church with you? What did you hope for their faith?
